The Project Repository Journal (PRj) is an interdisciplinary publication that brings together prolific members of academia and the scientific community to disseminate new, ongoing and finalised projects in a concise, informative and innovative manner.

The PRj's primary aim is to make research understandable and discoverable for a broad, global audience in the interests of open science communication.

Officially launched in 2019, the PRj has since gone from strength to strength, having helped over 250 publicly and privately funded research projects with their dissemination activities.

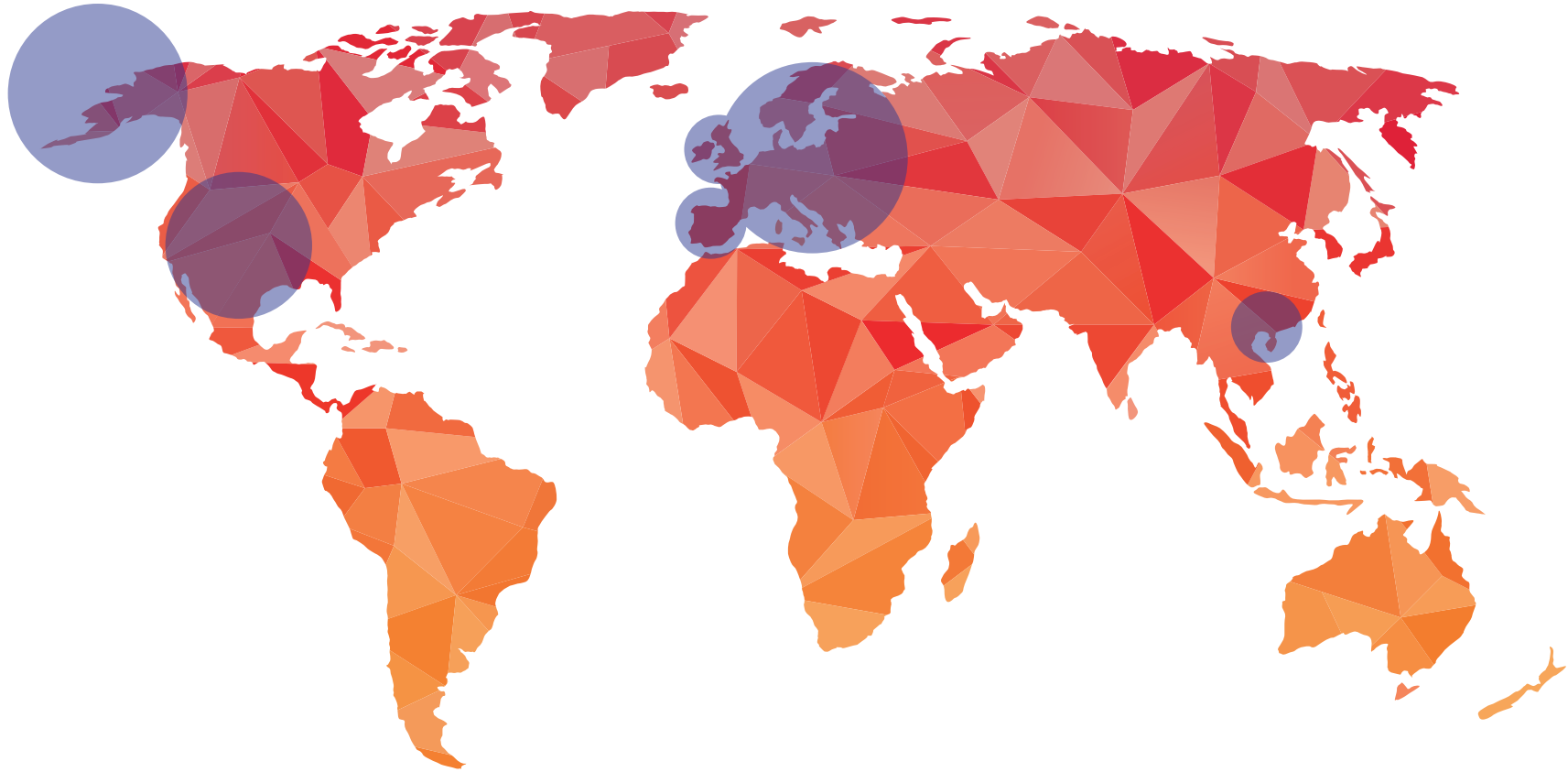
Topics such as current and future funding calls, science policy, European and worldwide initiatives, and research news are also included in the publication.

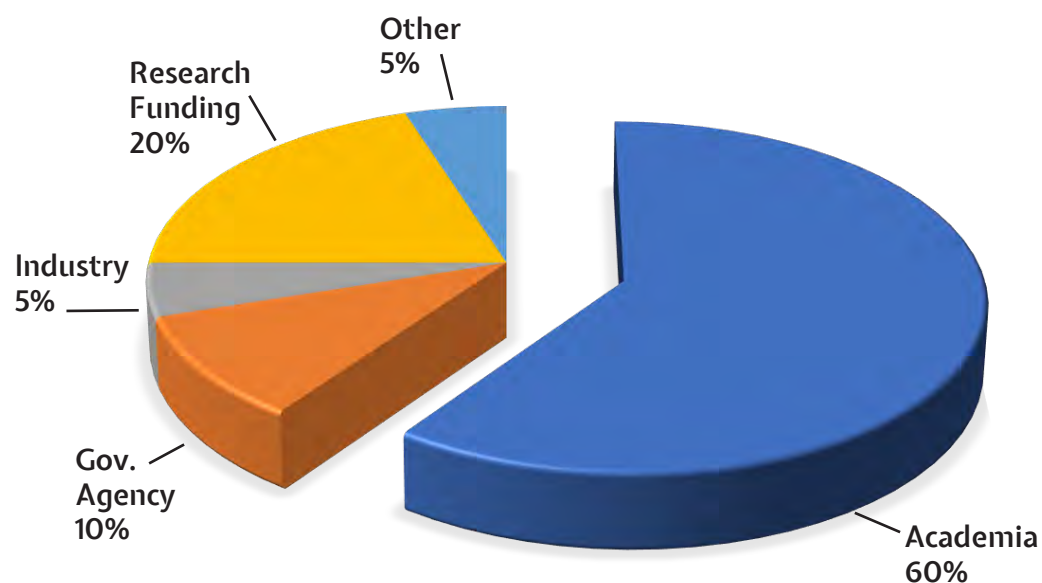
In addition to its concentrated European readership, the PRj also reaches audiences in China, Japan and the United States.

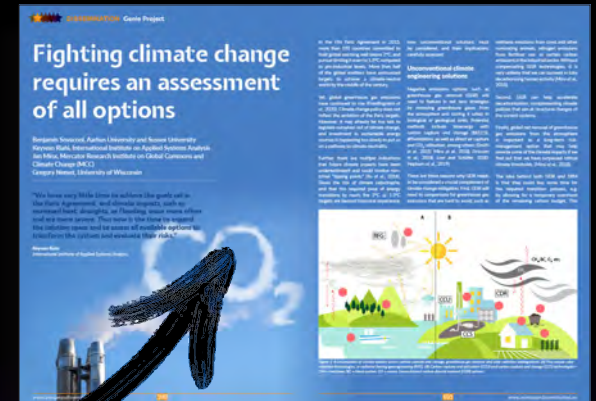

We are completely flexible with publishing dates. We know that research results and experiments don't work to article deadlines. You choose when you would like your articles to be published from our publication schedule, and we will accommodate you.

The content for each of the articles booked is completely down to you. If you are managing multiple projects or would like other members of the project to contribute, then this is completely fine.

Yes.

We produce everything under creative commons license (CC BY-NC 4.0), so copyright remains with the author. You are free to reproduce the article wherever you like in its original form. A final high-res PDF can be supplied to you upon request.

We ask for content to be submitted a minimum of five weeks before publication. As soon as you confirm you wish to publish, you will be assigned a dedicated support assistant. Your assistant will confirm your submission deadline based on your chosen publication date and the level of editorial support you require.

Yes.

If the article(s) you have booked is/are to be published after the project ends, we can provide an early invoice upon request. All invoices are processed whilst the project period is active and all costs are eligible from your grant with it being open-access.
